5 Things to Know for May 20, 2021

1. Governor Inslee signs the budget!

On May 18th, Governor Jay Inslee signed <u>SB</u> 5092 and <u>HB</u> 1080 containing the operating and capital budgets for the 2021-23 biennium. These budgets will go into effect on July 1. Though he partially vetoed some sections of the operating budget (available <u>here</u> with his veto message), no conservation district funding was impacted.

2. <u>Welcome to 16 new conservation district supervisors</u>

Today, the Washington State Conservation Commission certified elections and finalized appointments, resulting in 16 new conservation district supervisors entering our conservation district community. Please join WACD in welcoming them!

3. We are losing more than 150 years of experience

Please say thank you to the 16 conservation district supervisors who are leaving office this year. Their contributions represent more than 150 years of public service. WACD deeply appreciates their work on behalf of conservation.

4. Terry Cosby becomes the newest Chief of NRCS

May 19, 2021: The National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) applauded the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)'s appointment of **Terry Cosby** to serve as chief of USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS). As chief, Cosby will serve America's farmers, ranchers and forest landowners in their conservation efforts to help them conserve, maintain and improve natural resources and the environment through a network of over 3,000 offices in communities nationwide. Said NACD President Michael Crowder: "As longtime partners with NRCS, we look forward to working with Terry on the federal, state and local level, and I applaud Secretary Vilsack for appointing such a strong leader."

The next business meeting of the WACD Board of Directors on June 21st will be focused on reviewing and adopting the FY22 budget.

Committee work continues to advance

WACD Finance Committee work continues to move us forward. The Joint Committee on Elections meets again next week on May 26. We will set the date for the first meeting of the full Committee on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion by the end of this week.

Regarding the CDEI, I think the first meeting will be about getting to know each other, and about creating and agreeing to productive parameters to help the committee work well together. I expect that at the second meeting, the committee will begin to dive into how DEI is directly connected to conservation district work.


