Breaking News: Voluntary Conservation Approach Affirmed

This afternoon, the Washington State Conservation Commission discussed the voluntary approach to conservation and adopted the following motion:

To direct WSCC to participate in the state/tribal riparian process, consistent with agency mission, to conserve natural resources on all lands in Washington through technical assistance and voluntary, incentive based solutions in collaboration with conservation districts and other partners.

WACD appreciates the Conservation Commission's affirmation of a fundamental value of conservation district work that is described in <u>WACD's guiding principle #8</u>:

We believe in, and uphold, the practice of locally-led, voluntary, incentive-based conservation.

1. District Directory: we need your help now

With new conservation district board supervisors elected and appointed, and with several conservation district employee changes made or in process, it's time for WACD to update the statewide District Directory. We have sent requests for updated information to conservation districts but relatively few responses have been received. 3. It is shaping up to be another major fire season

All parts of Washington State are already well into wildfire season. While we often think of this as affecting mostly drier areas, wildfire can and does occur anywhere in Washington. 4. Next Generation Leadership Institute applicants sought

A goal of NGLI - aka the <u>Next Generation Leadership Institute</u> - is for at least two future leaders in each region to apply. We have not yet had any NGLI applicants from Washington State. If you have any interest in becoming a better leader locally, regionally, and nationally, WACD strongly encourages currently appointed or elected conservation district officials to apply.

5. Stay tuned for ask from Joint Committee on Elections

Yesterday, the Joint Committee on Elections held a long meeting to seek consensus on an option to present to conservation districts for comment. A request for comment will be sent to conservation district board supervisors and managers. You will have the option of replying as an individual or as representing an official position of your board.

Look for more information to be released next week. As part of the outreach to conservation districts, WACD will be hosting a statewide Q&A webinar as the Joint Committee on Elections looks to refine its initial work.
