2. WACD annual conference schedule is coming together

Registration for the 2021 WACD annual conference in November is now open at: https://hub.wadistricts.org/annual/2021meetings/conference/. The cost will be the same as last year: \$50 per person or \$150 per organization. The per-organization rate is a great deal as there is no limit to the number of your people who can attend.

The Sessions tab contains the draft conference schedule. This is a draft schedule so you can expect that it will change some over the next few weeks. We will be adding bios for presenters under the **Speakers** tab.

The **Sponsors** tab will house our 2021 conference sponsors. We are starting our push this week for sponsorships. 3. WACD annual business meeting details

There is the annual conference and then there is the annual meeting of members. The annual conference is where we come together to learn and to renew the bonds that help us work effectively, collectively. Those learning sessions will occur on nine dates in the first three weeks of November.

The WACD annual meeting - also called the annual business meeting - comes after the conference. It is where voting members discuss and decide resolutions and elect WACD officers. There will also be an election for the central Washington commissioner position on the Washington State Conservation Commission.

Despite COVID-related restrictions on gatherings, WACD still plans for an in-person business meeting on Tuesday, November 30th at the Hotel Murano in Tacoma. Masking and social distancing will be required. (For those who do not wish to attend in person, we will provide a means for you to participate virtually.)

WACD will provide a free banquet for in-person attendees on Monday, November 29th. The purpose of this is to renew relationships and resume the fellowship that makes our work together so productive. Tuesday's meals (breakfast, break, lunch) are not free. WACD will charge \$110 per person to cover those expenses. There won't be a charge to participate virtually.
