

WACD Legislative Update

January 16, 2023

This is WACD's first week of subscription-only legislative updates for 2023. These weekly updates contains timely information about legislative activities affecting conservation districts in Washington State.

1. WACD Testimony This Session

Executive Director Tom Salzer testified four times in the first week of session, all addressing the Governor's proposed FY23-25 <u>Operating Budget proposal</u> and <u>Capital Budget proposal</u> in both the House and the Senate. He also <u>submitted written</u> <u>testimony</u> on HB 1166 (Developing a water quality trading program).

He is also preparing remarks for Wednesday's public hearing in the House Ag and Natural Resources Committee on HB 1215 (Concerning the protection and restoration of riparian areas). Here is a summary of his forthcoming testimony:

WACD is testifying as OTHER on HB 1215. While we certainly support the intent of this legislation, we are concerned about two things: applying site potential tree height in situations where local soils and hydrology won't support woody riparian plant communities, and the interpretation and implementation of this legislation if adopted.

You can register to testify remotely on a bill by using this link and following the online instructions. Registration closes one hour before the scheduled start of the meeting for which you're seeking to speak. You also have the option to submit written testimony.
