Executive Corner

A visit to the Plant Materials Center

Today, Heather Wendt (WACD Director of Development and Engagement) and I spent the day at the WACD Plant Materials Center. It's been a very long time since we've been able to have an in-person staff meeting. Today was a welcome reconnection with the great folks who do so much for conservation and for your Association.

We spent three hours talking about successes and challenges, discussing immediate needs, and capturing some long-term goals. After a quick lunch, we headed out to the fields. John Knox (WACD PMC Assistant Nursery Manager) explained how the gravel bed holding system works. We walked several planting blocks and found the beds and plants to be in great condition.

Harvest has already started! A crew was packaging "sticks" today (large cuttings of willow, cottonwood, and dogwood) for use in a restoration project this fall. I'm including four photos from the visit, shown below.

I appreciate the work of our PMC folks. They manage 80 species on 60 acres, and each species has multiple age classes. Each plant block has specific cultural requirements to get those native plants to the condition you need for your conservation projects. The PMC is in constant motion every month of the year and I applaud all that they do!
