## 3. CD's 101 and CTA Legislative Education and Outreach

## Materials

## 4. 2025 Legislative Session

Departing Governor Jay Inslee released his draft FY25-27 budget on Tuesday, December 17th. You can find details for the Conservation Commission <u>here</u>. We expect Commission staff to release more details in the coming days comparing the current biennium's budget to this proposal.

For context, the House and Senate will release their budgets for the state's operating, capital, and transportation funds sometime in mid-late March.

If you haven't already, please consider subscribing to the <u>WACD Legislative Updates</u> that will begin with the new year. Each week, we'll provide information about the goings on in Olympia from our lobbyist Brynn Brady, highlight ways CDs can become involved in the legislative process, and track legislation that pertains to CDs.

## 5. Legislative Day Hotel Information

## End-of-year thoughts

One of those is the plethora of new elected officials who know nothing about the unique value provided in communities across the state by local conservation districts. With your help, we can build the awareness needed to gain the support each district will need in the upcoming

legislative session.

The state budget is also a concern. While I've been through this kind of cycle before, it is never comfortable. To weather this storm, we'll need to find ways to become more efficient, to acquire new partners, and to procure new funding. Maintaining current levels of funding is likely to be a heavy lift, and increasing the resources for conservation work may not be achievable. Nevertheless, we are moving forward with supporting significant funding asks so conservation districts can continue to thrive and deliver local solutions to local needs.

Together, we have the power to make a better future. Washington's network of 45 conservation districts is the best in the nation, so if anyone can do it, it's you. The hope each of us carries fuels our ability to meet the challenges and opportunities 2025 will bring.

I'm looking forward to doing this good work with you. I'm thankful for the strength of our community, grateful for your work, and hopeful for our future. **We are 45 STRONG and so much more!**
