

WACD Week 3 Legislative Update

January 28, 2025

1. Rates and Charges Bill Introduced

The rates and charges proposal worked on by WACD and CDs for the last eighteen months is now <u>House Bill 1488</u> and <u>Senate Bill 5510</u>. This bill, as proposed by the WACD resolutions adopted by the membership in 2023 and 2024, would allow counties to set the per parcel amount based on community need. If you have a legislator on the House Finance Committee or the Senate Ways & Means Committee, please write to them with your district's support for the bill.

2. WACD Bill Tracker for 2025

Our bill tracker for 2025 now has 80 bills on the list, with proposals ranging from turfgrass seed contracts (SB 5074) to the creation of new "environmental crimes" (SB 5360). Take a look at what we're tracking at <u>(https://wadistricts.us/wacd-watch-list/)</u>

3. Opportunities to Comment

One regular feature in our weekly legislative newsletter will be opportunities for our membership to engage with legislators each week of the legislative session. Online committee testimony is available for both the House and the Senate, you do not need to come to Olympia to speak at a Public Hearing for a bill. You can register to testify remotely on a bill by using this link and following the online instructions. Registration closes one hour before the scheduled start of the meeting for which you're seeking to speak. You also have the option to submit written testimony.

This week, here are a couple bills from our bill tracker scheduled for public hearings:

- <u>HB 1153</u> (Concerning urban forest management ordinances.) Scheduled for a public hearing on Wednesday, Jan 29th at 8 AM in the House Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources
- <u>HB 1309</u> (Addressing the impacts of burrowing shrimp on bottom culture shellfish farming through integrated pest management research.) Scheduled for a public hearing on Friday, Jan 31st at 10:30 in the House Committee on Agriculture and Natural Resources
