### 2. CD Elections Study Report

The Washington State Institute for Public Policy released <u>their study</u> on CD elections on June 27. Ryan Baye wrote a summary, an <u>"at a glance" version</u> of the fifty one page report, with some of his reflections.

The main takeaways is that there were no surprises for anyone who's taken part in these conversations over the last few years. Districts are concerned about the costs and the impact on operations. That cost? WSIPP estimates \$25,567,700 over four years if all five supervisor positions of all forty-five CDs had to be on the August primary and the November general ballots.

## 3. NRCS State Technical Advisory Committee Meeting

The next <u>State Technical Advisory Committee</u> meeting will be held virtually on **July 10th**. The meeting agenda with connection information can be found <u>here</u>.

The State Technical Advisory Committee (STAC) is a group composed of agricultural producers, owners/operators of nonindustrial private forest land, federal and state agency representatives, and other professionals who provide information, analysis, and recommendations to officials of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) on implementing and establishing priorities and criteria for natural resources conservation activities and programs.

# 5. National CD Employees Association Mid-Year Meeting

**Thursday 8/28**: full day tour and training at Spokane Conservation District's main property and nearby farm, featuring presentations and walking tours of programs and supporting funding; lunch on-site at Spokane CD and dinner/networking at adjacent event venue, Barn and Blossom.

**Who should attend**: Conservation District employees from Washington and surrounding states representing a range of positions and experience levels; this training/tour opportunity will have speakers and content applicable to both entry-level and long-term CD employees.
