A total of 289 in-person attendees participated in various tracks, including Riparian Restoration, Farms and Fields, Forestry and Agroforestry, Education, Communication and Outreach, IT and GIS, Management and Leadership, Administration and Finance, and in our general and closing sessions.

Envirothon Trivia raised \$1,626 to support the travel expenses of Washington State Envirothon students. Thank you to Ryan Baye, our entertaining trivia night host, and everyone who donated prizes as well as those who participated in this fundraising effort.
