The Washington Conservation Society (WCS), formed in 2007, is a 501(c)(3) whose mission is to promote natural resource conservation efforts in Washington State by providing a philanthropic center for investments in citizen-led, voluntary-based conservation projects, activities, education, and outreach efforts.

FY25 Activities: During this past fiscal year, WCS awarded five education mini-grants, totaling \$2,500, to support statewide natural resource education programs. In addition, we continued to use our 501(c)(3) status to support districts by acting as a pass-through entity for grants and donations. This past year, we helped districts secure an additional \$11,500. WCS also awarded a Conservation Futures Scholarship of \$1,000 to Haley Chisam from Entiat, WA, who is attending the University of Idaho, pursuing a degree in Natural Resources.

This year's Leaving a Legacy book will see the induction of six new members. This year's inductees include Harriet Berg, South Yakima CD; Lynn Brown, Kittitas Co. Conservation District; Gail Thornton, North Yakima CD; Jim Newhouse, South Yakima CD; Paul Newell, Underwood CD; and Tom McKern, Stevens Co. CD.

This year, we will be honoring two conservationists in our state by inducting them into the Creating a Legacy program. The award winner will be announced at the WACD Annual Meeting in Spokane on Monday night at the awards banquet.
